BASIC SAFETY RULES

1. NEVER POINT A FIREARM AT SOMETHING THAT IS NOT SAFE TO SHOOT.

Never let the muzzle of a firearm point at any part of your body or at another person. This is especially important when loading or unloading the firearm. When you are shooting at a target, know what is behind it. Some bullets can travel over a mile. If you miss your target or if the bullet penetrates the target, it is your responsibility to ensure that the shot does not cause unintended injury or damage.







2. ALWAYS HANDLE A FIREARM AS IF IT WERE LOADED.

Never assume that a firearm is unloaded. The only certain way to ensure there are no cartridges in a firearm is to open the chamber and visually and physically examine the inside to see if a round is present. Removing or unloading the magazine will not guarantee that a firearm is unloaded or cannot fire. Firearms can be checked by cycling or removing rounds and by then opening the chamber so that a visual inspection of the chamber for any remaining rounds can be made.









3. STORE YOUR FIREARM SO THAT IT IS WELL OUT OF CHILDREN'S REACH.

It is your responsibility to ensure that children under the age of 21 or other unauthorized persons cannot gain access to your firearm. To reduce the risk of accidents involving children, unload your firearm, lock it in a safe place, and store the ammunition in a separate locked location. Please note that devices intended to prevent accidents such as: cable locks, chamber plugs, etc., may not prevent use or misuse of your firearm by a determined person. Firearm storage in a steel gun safe may be more appropriate to reduce the likelihood of intentional misuse of a firearm by a child or unauthorized person.





4. NEVER SHOOT AT WATER OR AT HARD SURFACES.

Shooting at the surface of water or at a rock or other hard surfaces increases the chance of ricochets or fragmentation of the bullet or shot, which can result in the projectile striking an unintended or peripheral target.



5. MAKE SURE YOU KNOW THE SAFETY FEATURES OF THE FIREARM YOU ARE USING, BUT REMEMBER: SAFETY DEVICES ARE NOT A SUBSTITUTE FOR SAFE HANDLING PROCEDURES.

Never rely solely on a safety device to prevent an accident. It is imperative that you know and use the specific safety devices of the particular firearm you are handling, but the best way to prevent accidents is to follow the safe handling procedures described in these safety rules and elsewhere in the product manual. To further familiarize yourself with the proper use of this or other firearms, take a Firearms Safety Course taught by an expert in firearm use and safety procedures.

6. PROPERLY MAINTAIN YOUR FIREARM.

Store and carry your firearm so that dirt or lint does not accumulate in the working parts. Clean and oil your firearm after each use, following the instructions provided in this manual, to prevent corrosion, damage to the barrel or the accumulation of impurities which can prevent use of the firearm in an emergency. Always check the barrel and chamber(s) before loading to ensure that they are clean and free from obstructions. Firing with an obstruction in the barrel or chamber can rupture the barrel and injure you or others nearby. In the event you hear an unusual noise when shooting, stop firing immediately, engage the manual safety and unload the firearm. Make sure the chamber and barrel are free from any obstruction, such as a bullet blocked inside the barrel due to defective or improper ammunition.



7. USE SUITABLE AMMUNITION.

Only use factory-loaded, new ammunition manufactured to industry specifications: CIP (Europe and elsewhere), SAAMI[®] (U.S.A.). Be certain that every round you use is in the proper caliber and type for the particular firearm. The caliber of the firearm is clearly marked on the barrel. The use of reloaded or remanufactured ammunition can increase the likelihood of excessive cartridge pressures, case-head ruptures or other defects in the ammunition that can cause damage to your firearm and injury to yourself or others nearby.

8. ALWAYS WEAR PROTECTIVE GLASSES AND EARPLUGS WHEN SHOOTING.

The chance that gas, gunpowder residue or metal fragments will blow back and injure a shooter who is firing a gun is rare; however, the injury that can be sustained in such circumstances can be severe, including the possible loss of eyesight. A shooter must always wear impact-resistant shooting glasses when firing any firearm. Noise-reducing earplugs or headphones will reduce the risk of damage to hearing caused by prolonged shooting activity.

9. NEVER CLIMB A TREE, FENCE OR OBSTRUCTION, AND NEVER JUMP OVER DITCHES WITH A LOADED FIREARM.

Open and empty the chamber(s) of your firearm and engage the manual safety before climbing up or down a tree or before climbing a fence or jumping over a ditch or other obstruction. Never pull or push a loaded firearm toward yourself or another person. Always unload a firearm, then visually and physically check to make sure that the magazine, loading mechanism and chamber(s) are unloaded, and the action is open before handing it to another person. Never take a firearm from another person unless it is unloaded, and was visually and physically checked to confirm it is unloaded. Only take a firearm when the action is open.

10. AVOID ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES OR JUDGEMENT/REFLEX IMPAIRING MEDICATION WHEN SHOOTING.

Never drink and shoot. If you take medication that can impair motor reactions or judgment, do not handle a firearm while you are under the influence of this medication or alcohol..







11. NEVER TRANSPORT A LOADED FIREARM.

Always unload a firearm before putting it in a vehicle (chamber empty, magazine empty). Hunters and target shooters should load their firearm only at their destination, and only when they are ready to shoot. If you carry a firearm for self-protection, leaving the chamber unloaded can reduce the chance of unintentional discharge.



12. LEAD WARNING.

Discharging firearms in poorly ventilated areas, cleaning firearms, or handling ammunition may result in exposure to lead and other substances known to cause birth defects, reproductive harm, and other serious physical injury. Always use a firearm in a suitably ventilated area. Wash hands thoroughly after exposure to these substances.

DESCRIPTION

A line of pistols derived from a firearm that was proven to exceed military standards, the Beretta 90 series delivers outstanding accuracy and reliability in the most demanding conditions. The open slide design and optimal direct feed system allow Beretta 90 series pistols to perform exceptionally with most commercial ammunition, and its barrel and falling locking block allow for a high degree of mechanical accuracy.

GENERAL OPERATION

Beretta 90 series pistols are semiautomatic falling locking block firearms. Upon firing, the inertia of the fired cartridge pushes the slide back, ejects the spent cartridge, cocks the hammer and compresses the recoil spring. The slide will then automatically move forward to the closed position, feeding the next cartridge from the magazine into the chamber. The slide is designed to stay open after the last round has been fired and ejected.

FIELD STRIPPING

The disassembly lever is designed to allow a quick and simple field stripping of the pistol without the need for pulling the trigger, and also to prevent unintentional disassembly.

OVERSIZED MAGAZINE CATCH

Many modern 90 series are equipped with an oversized magazine catch, allowing the user to easily remove the magazine from the gun. The magazine release catch can be reversed to allow easier access for left-handed shooters.

FRAME

Traditional: The shape of the classic 90 series grip helps shooters mitigate recoil.

Vertec: The 92XI, 92X and M9A4 feature a reduced circumference frame that allows for a range of ergonomic options for shooters of all sizes. Each gun comes with a set of grip panels that allows for a smaller fit pistol, and a wrap-around back strap grip that can be installed and is an enhanced variant of the traditional 90 series full size grip.

SLIDE STOP

When the last round has been fired, the slide locks open signaling that the magazine is empty. The slide stop can also be used to close the slide when loading the pistol.

MAGAZINE CAPACITY

The standard magazines on Beretta 92 full size and Centurion size caliber 9mm pistols are 10, 15, 17 or 18 rounds depending on state law. The standard magazines on Beretta 92 Compact size caliber 9mm pistols are 10, 13 or 15 rounds depending on state law. All 92s are compatible with other magazines in the 92 family (so long as the magazines are equal to or longer than the grip length). FRAME CHECKERING


Some models in the 90 series have enhanced checkering on the front and back strap to allow for a more secure grip on the pistol.



BARREL UPGRADES

The 90 series can come with, or be upgraded to, a barrel that has a recessed cut target crown for enhanced accuracy, or an extended barrel threaded for 1/2X28.





PICATINNY RAIL

Railed models of the 90 Series such as the M9A1, 92X, M9A3/4, 92G Elite LTT and 92 Vertec come with a 1913 Picatinny compatible rail under the barrel (figure below) for convenient mounting of a laser aiming device, flashlight or other type of accessory.

Beretta does not recommend the attachment of any accessory to the pistol rail that is heavier than 6 oz (170 g), or that protrudes more than 3/4" (19 mm) from the front of the slide. Using overweight or oversized accessories could cause the pistol to malfunction and/or decrease the service life of the pistol.

Sights

Many Beretta 90 Series pistols are equipped with removable front and rear sights. 92XI, 92X, M9A3/4, 92G Elite LTT and 92 Vertec sights are all compatible with one another.





RED DOT COMPATIBILITY



ALWAYS ENSURE THAT THE PISTOL IS UNLOADED, INCLUDING VERIFYING THAT THERE IS NO ROUND IN THE CHAMBER, BEFORE INSTALLING OR REMOVING AN ACCESSORY TO/FROM THE PISTOL RAIL. NEVER PLACE YOUR HAND IN FRONT OF THE MUZZLE WHEN INSTALLING OR REMOVING AN ACCESSORY TO/FROM THE PISTOL RAIL.

SAFETY FEATURES

AUTOMATIC FIRING PIN BLOCK

When the trigger is not pulled completely back, the firing pin block secures the firing pin and prevents it from moving forward, even if the weapon should fall and strike the ground.

MANUAL SAFETY LEVER

The actuation of the safety rotates a sear block in place that prevents the sear from releasing the hammer. With the safety engaged, the slide is also prevented from being fully retracted.

ALWAYS LEAVE THE MANUAL SAFETY ENGAGED (ON "SAFE") UNTIL YOU INTEND TO FIRE.

TO USE YOUR FIREARM IN A SAFE MANNER - NEVER RELY SOLELY ON MECHANICAL FEATURES -ALWAYS BE EXTREMELY CAREFUL AND USE SAFE GUN HANDLING PRACTICES TO AVOID SITUATIONS THAT COULD LEAD TO AN ACCIDENT. ALWAYS INSPECT THE OPEN CHAMBER AFTER THE MAGAZINE HAS BEEN REMOVED.

AMMUNITION

AMMUNITION (CARTRIDGE) NOTICE

Beretta specifically disclaims responsibility for any damage or injury whatsoever occurring in connection with, or as the result of, the use in a 90 series pistol in caliber 9mm of faulty, non-standard, "remanufactured", or hand-loaded (reloaded) ammunition or cartridges other than those for which the firearm was originally chambered.

Use Proper Ammunition

Use only high-quality, commercially-manufactured ammunition that is manufactured in accordance with CIP (Europe and elsewhere) or SAAMI[®] (USA) standards. Be certain that the ammunition is the appropriate caliber and loading for the firearm and is clean, dry and in good condition. The cartridge designation for your firearm is marked on the sides of the slide.

The use of reloaded or remanufactured ammunition can increase the likelihood of excessive cartridge pressures, case-head ruptures or other defects in the ammunition that can cause damage to your firearm and injury to yourself or others nearby. There is a broad array of 9mm ammunition made by many manufacturers in different brands and types. To ensure reliable operation, a semi-automatic firearm must be matched to a certain cartridge load. The Beretta 92XI in caliber 9mm has been designed for high quality standard ammunition. Beretta suggests that you try several boxes of a recommended brand/type of ammunition in your 90 series pistol before you put it into regular use to determine reliability of ignition and performance of your ammunition. If issues occur, try different recommended brands until a reliable load is found.

CAREFULLY INSPECT EACH CARTRIDGE BEFORE IT IS LOADED IN THE MAGAZINE. BE CERTAIN THE CARTRIDGE CASES ARE NOT SPLIT, DEFORMED OR DO NOT POSSESS ANY OTHER DENTS OR DEFECTS.

DO NOT FIRE OLD AMMUNITION IN THIS FIREARM. PRIMERS, POWDER, CARTRIDGE CASES AND BULLETS CAN DETERIORATE WITH TIME AND CAUSE DAMAGE TO THE FIREARM, OR INJURY TO THE SHOOTER OR OTHERS.

DO NOT USE NON-STANDARD, "REMANUFACTURED", OR HAND-LOADED (RELOADED) AMMUNITION OR CARTRIDGES OTHER THAN THOSE FOR WHICH THE FIREARM WAS ORIGINALLY CHAMBERED. LOADING



LOADING THE MAGAZINE

To load the magazine, remove it from the pistol by depressing the magazine catch.



Hold the magazine in the one hand, and with your other hand place a cartridge on the follower in front of the feed lips. Press down and slide the cartridge completely back under the feed lips.



Repeat until the magazine is fully loaded.



Do not try to force more than the maximum indicated rounds into the magazine.

LOADING THE PISTOL AND THE CHAMBER

ONCE THE PISTOL'S CHAMBER IS LOADED, TO PREVENT ACCIDENTAL DISCHARGE, PRESS THE SAFETY LOCK UP INTO THE LOCKED POSITION, AND ALWAYS KEEP YOUR FINGER AWAY FROM THE TRIGGER WHENEVER YOU DO NOT INTEND TO FIRE. FAILURE TO FOLLOW THESE STEPS COULD RESULT IN SERIOUS INJURY OR DEATH.

Insert the loaded magazine into the pistol grip completely to ensure proper magazine catch engagement.



Grasping the slide serrations with thumb and index finger, fully retract and release the slide to load the chamber.



Once the chamber is loaded, press the safety up into the locked position until ready to fire.





Fire by pressing the trigger.

NOTE: The Beretta 90 series pistol described in this manual is equipped with a firing pin block which prevents firing pin inertia from striking the cartridge when the pistol is dropped. This safety is overcome only by fully depressing the trigger to the rear.

To replace the round which has been chambered from the magazine:

- Remove the magazine from the pistol by depressing the magazine release catch.
- Insert one more cartridge into the magazine.
- Insert the loaded magazine into the pistol grip completely to ensure catch engagement.

FIRING

WHEN READY TO FIRE

Aim the pistol and align the front and rear sight on target.

Release the manual safety by rotating the manual safety lever down with thumb pressure. The red warning dot can be seen when the manual safety is disengaged. The discharge will cycle the slide, which will eject the fired cartridge case and cock the hammer. The slide will automatically close, feeding the next cartridge from the magazine into the chamber.

THE PISTOL'S CHAMBER IS NOW LOADED, TO PREVENT ACCIDENTAL DISCHARGE, PRESS THE SAFETY LOCK UP INTO THE LOCKED POSITION, AND ALWAYS KEEP YOUR FINGER AWAY FROM THE TRIGGER WHENEVER YOU DO NOT INTEND TO FIRE. FAILURE TO FOLLOW THESE STEPS COULD RESULT IN SERIOUS INJURY OR DEATH.

Press the trigger to fire again.

NOTE: When the last round has been fired the slide will remain open.



To fire again, depress the magazine release catch and remove the empty magazine and insert a loaded one.

Press the slide stop or retract the slide to close the slide and load the chamber.



Once the chamber is loaded, press the safety up into the locked position until ready to fire.

UNLOADING THE PISTOL AND CHAMBER

PREVENT ACCIDENTAL DISCHARGE. THE SLIDE CAN NOT BE RACKED WITH THE SAFETY ON FOR PISTOL UNLOADING. WHEN UNLOADING, NEVER PRESS THE TRIGGER. FAILURE TO FOLLOW THESE STEPS CAN RESULT IN SERIOUS INJURY OR DEATH.

Depress the magazine release catch and remove the magazine from the pistol.




Grasping the slide serrations with thumb and index finger, fully retract the slide to remove the chambered cartridge.

UNLOADING THE MAGAZINE

To unload the magazine, grasp the magazine box with one hand, bottom down and with front end forward. With the tip of the thumb, firmly press down on the cartridge rim and push the top round forward. As the bullet moves forward, tip it slightly upward with the index finger. Repeat until the magazine is unloaded.



DISASSEMBLY

Every time the pistol is fired, or at least once a month, cleaning and lubricating is recommended.

FIELD STRIPPING

MAKE SURE THE PISTOL IS UNLOADED. IF NOT, UNLOAD THE PISTOL. SEE "UNLOADING THE PISTOL AND CHAMBER" PAGE 16 FOR MORE INFORMATION. FAILURE TO FOLLOW THESE STEPS COULD RESULT IN SERIOUS INJURY OR DEATH.

Remove magazine by depressing magazine release catch.



Press and hold the disassembly lever release button.



While holding the disassembly lever release button, rotate the disassembly lever clockwise until it stops.



Pull the slide assembly forward.




Recoil spring and recoil spring guide are under tension.


Slightly press recoil spring and spring guide towards muzzle to separate them from the barrel.



Lift the spring guide and recoil spring, letting the spring out slowly, as it is under tension.



Remove the barrel and locking block assembly from slide.



ANotice

Beretta recommends any further disassembly be performed by a qualified gunsmith.



GRIP PANELS REMOVE AND INSTALL

Back Strap Grip

Applies to Vertec-framed models: 92Xi, 92X lines and the M9A3, M9A4 lines.

MAKE SURE THE PISTOL IS UNLOADED. IF NOT, UNLOAD THE PISTOL. SEE "UNLOADING THE PISTOL AND CHAMBER" ON PAGE 14 FOR MORE INFORMATION.

Using a 2 mm allen wrench, remove the grip screws by turning them counterclockwise.



ANotice

Be careful not to lose the lock washers located under the grip screws.

Remove the grip panels from the lower receiver.



Slide the back strap grip over the rear of the lower receiver.



Install the lock washers and grip screws with a 2 mm allen wrench by turning them clockwise. Tighten the grip screws to a torque of 10 lb·in.



MAINTENANCE

DO NOT ATTEMPT TO MAKE REPAIRS TO ANY FIREARM WITHOUT PROPER KNOWLEDGE OR TRAINING. DO NOT ALTER PARTS OR USE SUBSTITUTE PARTS NOT MADE BY BERETTA. ANY ALTERATIONS OR ADJUSTMENTS THAT MAY BE NECESSARY TO THE OPERATING MECHANISM SHOULD BE PERFORMED BY THE MANUFACTURER OR A BERETTA AUTHORIZED SERVICE CENTER.

CLEANING AND LUBRICATING

The firearm should be cleaned as soon as possible after firing. Use only high-quality, commercially-available firearm cleaning solvents and cleaning equipment.

EXCESS OIL AND GREASE OBSTRUCTING THE BORE, EVEN PARTIALLY, IS VERY DANGEROUS WHEN FIRING AND MAY CAUSE BARREL RUPTURE AND SERIOUS INJURY TO THE SHOOTER AND BYSTANDERS. NEVER SPRAY OR APPLY OIL TO CARTRIDGES. USE LUBRICANTS PROPERLY. YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE PROPER CARE AND MAINTENANCE OF YOUR FIREARM.

MAKE SURE THE PISTOL IS UNLOADED. IF NOT, UNLOAD THE PISTOL. SEE "UNLOADING THE PISTOL AND CHAMBER" PAGE 16 FOR MORE INFORMATION.

The firearm should not be disassembled for cleaning beyond what is described. Only gunsmiths or other highly-trained personnel who are familiar with these firearms should conduct further disassembly.

It is advisable to carry out the field stripping and the assembly operations over a table to catch components, should they drop.

Disassemble the firearm as previously described in this manual. See "Disassembly" page 17 for more information.

Barrel

Clean the barrel with bore solvent and a brush and then dry it with cleaning patches. Always begin at the chamber end. Repeat until the barrel is clean. Wipe down exterior of barrel locking block and lug assembly with a solvent soaked patch. Allow to dry, then apply lubrication in the lug and locking block area.

Lightly oil the inside and outside of the barrel, using a clean patch soaked in gun oil. Lightly oil the locking block.

Slide

Clean the slide with a cloth and/or brush soaked in gun oil, paying special attention to the breech face, extractor, slide rails and under side of breech. Wipe clean.

Lightly oil the slide. Apply a few drops of oil down the rails of the slide.

Recoil Spring and Spring Guide

Lightly oil the recoil spring and spring guide with gun oil. After prolonged use, it may be necessary to first clean with gun oil and a brush.

Frame

With a gun oil soaked rag or brush, clean all areas covered by gunpowder residue and dirt.

Wipe clean and lightly lubricate rails and moving parts. Be sure to oil the disassembly lever, magazine catch, slide stop, trigger system, hammer, sear and the levers in front of the hammer.

Magazine Cleaning and Cartridge Rotation

Be sure to thoroughly clean the magazine(s). After cleaning, wipe with a lightly oil moistened rag.

ANotice

If the pistol is carried with chamber and magazine loaded, it is important to periodically unload all magazines for cartridge inspection.

AFTER CLEANING AND LUBRICATING CHECKS

Assemble the firearm and check for proper function. See "Assembly" page 20 for more information.

Verify the gun is ON SAFE.

Insert an EMPTY magazine and retract the slide so that the slide remains in the open position.

Pull the slide rearward, then release it to close the slide.



ASSEMBLY

Assemble following the Field Stripping procedure in reverse order. It is advisable to pay attention to the following points:

The barrel must rest perfectly flush against the slide (the extractor must lodge in its groove in the barrel).



The recoil spring guide head should lodge in the center of its groove in the locking block.



Make sure the barrel locking assembly is in rear-most position. If necessary, push the barrel locking assembly to the rear using the open area at the slide.

Slightly retract the slide, and rotate the disassembly lever to the locked position.



RED DOT SIGHT

INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this section is to provide instructions on how to install and remove the red dot aiming device on your RDO compatible Beretta 90 series pistol. For handling and loading information for your Beretta 90 series pistol, refer to the User Manual and Basic Safety Rules sections of this document.

INSTALLATION

A WARNING


BEFORE INSTALLING THE AIMING DEVICE, UNLOAD THE PISTOL. SEE "UNLOADING THE PISTOL AND CHAMBER" PAGE 16 FOR MORE INFORMATION.

To install the red dot aiming device, remove the cover plates from the slide of your red dot optic (RDO) compatible Beretta 90 series pistol by unscrewing the two screws (socket countersunk M3X5) using a 2 mm allen wrench.

Install the mounting plate on top of the slide and fasten it with the two socket cap screws M3X6 using a 2.5 mm allen wrench.

A SIGHT THAT IS NOT MOUNTED SECURELY MAY BECOME DETACHED UPON RECOIL OF FIREARM. IF IT BECOMES DETACHED, IT MAY FLY BACK AND STRIKE THE SHOOTER OR BYSTANDER CAUSING INJURY. NOTE THE CONDITION OF THE MOUNTING SCREWS AFTER FIRING (GOOD PRACTICE IS TO MARK THE SCREW HEAD TO MAKE ANY ROTATION CLEARLY VISIBLE). IF THE MOUNTING SCREWS SHOW SIGNS OF LOOSENING, DO NOT FIRE THE GUN AGAIN UNTIL YOU HAVE TIGHTENED THE SCREWS. THE ORIGINAL SCREWS COME WITH A DROP OF GLUE APPLIED; IF THE SCREWS DO BEGIN TO LOOSEN, REMOVE THEM, CLEAN THE SCREWS AND THREADS, APPLY THREAD LOCKING COMPOUND TO THE SCREWS AND REASSEMBLE. LET THE THREAD LOCKING COMPOUND CURE BEFORE USING THE FIREARM. Install your aiming device on the mounting plate.

Using the screws, fasten the sight onto the slide using the appropriate allen wrench.

- 2 Cover plate


REMOVAL

BEFORE REMOVING THE AIMING DEVICE, UNLOAD THE PISTOL. SEE "UNLOADING THE PISTOL AND CHAMBER" PAGE 16 FOR MORE INFORMATION.

To remove the red dot aiming device, unscrew the fastening screws and remove them and the device.

Remove the mounting plate by unscrewing the fastening socket cap screws M3X6 using a 2.5mm allen wrench.

Install the cover plates to the slide of your Beretta 90 series pistol, fastening them with two socket countersunk M3X5 by means of a 2mm allen wrench.

TROUBLESHOOTING

Failure to fire.

If the trigger is pulled and the firearm does not immediately fire:

IF THE FIREARM FAILS TO FIRE IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE TRIGGER IS PULLED, CEASE FIRING IMMEDIATELY. FAILURE TO FOLLOW THIS WARNING COULD RESULT IN DEATH OR SERIOUS INJURY.

- Keep the firearm pointed in a SAFE direction in the event a "hang-fire" has occurred. A hang-fire occurs when there is a delay in a cartridge's ignition.
- With the firearm pointed in a SAFE direction, wait 1 full minute.
- After 1 full minute has elapsed, completely unload the firearm. See "Unloading the Pistol and Chamber" page 16 for more information.
- Carefully inspect your ammunition.
- Immediately consult qualified personnel such as a gunsmith if the firing pin indent on a fired cartridge's primer is light or does not exist.

NEVER ATTEMPT TO FIRE AMMUNITION THAT DID NOT FIRE THE FIRST TIME.

Firing with an obstruction in the barrel or chamber can rupture the barrel and injure you or others nearby.

• In the event you hear an unusual noise when shooting, stop firing immediately, engage the manual safety and unload the firearm. Make sure the chamber and barrel are free from any obstruction, like a bullet blocked inside the barrel due to defective or improper ammunition.

IF ANOTHER CARTRIDGE IS FIRED INTO AN OBSTRUCTED BARREL, A CATASTROPHIC FAILURE CAN RESULT.

• With the gun pointed in a SAFE DIRECTION, COMPLETELY UNLOAD the firearm. See "Unloading the Pistol and Chamber" page 16 for more information.

Barrel obstruction

• Using the disassembly instructions, field strip the firearm and check to be sure there are no obstructions in the barrel. If a barrel obstruction is detected, qualified personnel such as a gunsmith must remove the obstruction and inspect the firearm before it can be fired.

IF ANOTHER CARTRIDGE IS FIRED INTO AN OBSTRUCTED BARREL, A CATASTROPHIC FAILURE CAN RESULT.

THE FIREARM SHOULD ALWAYS BE STORED UNLOADED, WITH THE BOLT IN THE CLOSED POSITION, THE SAFETY ENGAGED AND THE HAMMER DECOCKED. SEE "UNLOADING THE PISTOL AND CHAMBER" PAGE 16 FOR MORE INFORMATION.

Do not store the shotgun in a leather or fabric case. These materials attract moisture, even though they may appear to be perfectly dry.


